They added three more insurance runs in the ninth, two on another hit by Thomas that gave them their final margin of victory.

Parker finished his monster game with six RBIs, followed by Thomas with three and Marinelli with two. Mike Gerace contributed three hits to the cause for the winners, who advanced to the championship round with the win.
